Religious Education

Alongside our collective worship in school and weekly visits to church, Class 3 will be learning about 'What kind of world did Jesus want?' and 'What can we learn from visiting sacred places?'

DT/ART

In DT the children will be focusing on food and cooking. The children will design and produced a themed banquet. In Art the children will be producing monarch sketches and portraits.

<u> ICT</u>

ICT will link in with out topic of 'Meet the Monarchs'. The children will be taking a significant event and studying it, before putting themselves in the role of a real life reporter, and using 'IMovie' to present a journalistic report.

<u>Literacy</u>

This term, the children will have the opportunities to write across several genres. There will be a focus on writing fiction and using speech to move the action along. The children will also write a script, produce a piece of promotional material and write narrative poetry using couplets.

Examples of activities planned are SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar) and Guided Reading lessons take place weekly too.

<u>Music</u>

This term, specialist music providers will teach the children. This term, the children will learn to play the Ukulele.

Meet the Monarchs!



<u>Understanding physical de-</u> velopment, health and wellbeing.

Class 3 will be learning about Rights, Rules and Responsibilities. During this topic they will learn about democracy and our modern day government. In PSHE lessons we will also be looking at personal safety and managing chance.

French

This term Mrs Barker will be teaching the children French phrases for places in a town. Children will be learning how to ask for and give directions to certain places.

<u>Science</u>

The topic in science this term is 'The eye.' Class 3 will be learning about how the eye works and how different parts of the eye help us see. children will be looking at optical illusions and looking at objects from different perspectives. Science will be linked to our topic where possible.

History/ Geography

This term the children will be looking at significant turning points in British History. We will follow on from our Anglo Saxon and Viking unit by revising the structure of the monarchy during those times, before studying King John and the Magna Carta. The children will then be studying another monarch whose reign saw much change for Britain— Henry VIII. The children will learn about the break from Rome and the impact that this had. The children will finally learn about the Stuarts and the changes in Parliament during this period.

Numeracy

This term we will be focusing on the following Numeracy areas: statistics, shapes and angles, reflection and translation in all four quadrants.

Problem solving and investigations will play an ongoing central part in most Maths lessons and where possible, we will try and link this to our topic. The children will also be encouraged to explain how they have calculated answers to problems to help to develop their mathematical fluency and understanding.
