It has been a rather busy, hectic week here at St. Lawrence Primary! Firstly, on behalf of Miss Osterfield and myself and the Governing Body we would like to thank you whole heartedly for your support and co operation with our two day OFSTED Inspection this week and in particular, your engagement with the Parent Survey and Parent View. Additionally, we would like to place on record our thanks to the staff for their dedication and hard work and placing the needs of the children at the forefront of everything they do. As usual, the pupils here at St, Lawrence were a sheer delight to teach and the motto of our school 'being the best we can be with God' radiated through every aspect of school life and showed our visitor what a special, wonderful place St. Lawrence School is! As part of the Inspection process school records were checked, lessons observed (in every class), pupils and staff interviewed, playtimes and lunchtimes monitored as well as in-depth discussions held with the School Leadership Team (SLT). We will share 'Her Majesty's Inspector's Report 'when it is published, this usually takes a number of weeks.

On Tuesday next week, we are very excited to announce the launch of the 'Commando Joe' programme which we will be implementing in school. We will be welcoming Commando Stuart to lead sessions across school and would like to invite parents from 2.30pm onwards to see a taster of the session on the school playground (weather permitting). The essence of the programme is to build the confidence and resilience of primary school children. Children with high self-esteem are able to make difficult decisions under pressure, approach adults for support, and be self sufficient in their learning. This programme helps develop this resilience through a variety of different activities including being part of a team and supporting each other to succeed. We ask that children come dressed in their PE school kit on this day, wearing suitable footwear.

Last week Mr Al-Asmar took eight children from Year 3 and 4 to a Kwik Cricket competition held at Oakengates Tennis Centre. Feedback from Mr Al-Asmar indicated that he was immensely proud of the team for the way they supported each other and were so enthusiastic during the whole event. Well done to Oliver, Ruben, Ciaran, Charlie Lizzie, Ella, Lola and Graciella for representing St. Lawrence Primary School and really showcasing the 'St. Lawrence Way!'
