Friday 5th May 2020

This week we have started our phased return here at St. Lawrence and have welcomed back our key worker children to the school community in the first instance. As you will be aware throughout this time we have been caring for our key worker children but utilising a hub approach based at Tibberton Primary School, which has been hugely successful. It has been lovely to be back at St, Lawrence site this week though, seeing the children back in their own environment. We look forward to welcoming Reception children in the coming weeks as a staggered approach.

Since the announcement from the government, we have been working extremely hard to establish new routines and new ways of working in order to meet government guidance and keep members of the school community as safe as possible. The guidance is that we prioritise the return to school of four groups; the children of our key workers, Reception, year 1 and Year 6 based on the capacity of staff and accommodation of the building. I do hope that you acknowledge that we will always place the safety of children, staff and the wider community at the forefront of our decision making.
