

Class 2's investigation

This week we have linked our Science, Forest School and Fairy Tale themes together to carry out an investigation about which material would make the best roof for The Three Little Pigs. We designed our experiment so that water was poured onto the different roof materials from the same height before we measured the amount of water let through into the house. The children really enjoyed themselves and came to the conclusion that a roof should never be made from fabric.

In Computing, we set each other binary number targets to make using our binary digit cards. The children were really enthusiastic about this and made numbers such as 23 and 31 using our digit cards or 1 / 2 / 4 / 8 / 16.
