Dear Parent/Carers, 26th November 2020

It has been so lovely to welcome the children back into school this week. They have settled back in well to the school routine and their laughter and enthusiasm to learn has filled the school with a wonderful energy. We would like to thank you for your support with our Remote Learning Provision over the last two weeks. The children produced and uploaded some excellent work to SeeSaw.

The weather really has begun to feel more like Winter this week and some of the children in school have been extremely enthusiastic in telling stories of how cold some of the mornings have been and how much ice has been scraped off cars. The colder temperatures outside are becoming an increasing factor on school life as we continue through the term, but despite the colder weather, all classes have been making use of our Forest School Area this week.

As we currently need to keep all our classes well ventilated, and the weather is getting cooler, we encourage the children to wear extra layers underneath sweatshirts and tops: a simple extra T-shirt or sweatshirt would be ideal and they can always peal the layers off if they become too warm in class.

From next week, we begin the proper countdown!

Once we hit December 1<sup>st</sup>, there is no getting away from the fact that Christmas is coming and despite the current national pandemic, as a school, we intend to enjoy Christmas to the full. We are planning our activities and will keep you up to date through the newsletters with all the exciting things that will be going on. On Page 2 of this Newsletter we have outlined the plan for Christmas Card Giving in school this year. We have been in consultation with the Telford & Wrekin Health & Safety Team to plan a safe as possible Christmas Card giving this year.





Unfortunately, we were not able to hold our two minute silence on the 11th November in school as planned. However, we still upheld this very important Act of Remembrance by creating a display in the Quiet Garden on Tuesday.



The children really enjoyed painting stones, making paper poppies and artwork. Our Class Worships in the weeks building up to Remembrance Day focused on this and the children were very knowledgeable and aware of the Act of Remembrance. We would like to give a special thanks to Mrs Sankey for her wonderful contribution in painting the focal memorial stone.

The 30th November sees the celebration of St Andrews Day in Scotland and for Scottish families located around the world. In school, we will be using our well-being time on Friday afternoon to discuss St Andrews Day and carry out activities on this theme.

#### Christmas Cards

We all understand how much the children love to give and receive Christmas cards. To make sure that we can do this in school for those children who want to give cards, we must follow a few COVID related rules in school.

- ⇒ Cards can be brought into school from Tuesday December 1<sup>st</sup> until Tuesday December 8<sup>th</sup> (which will be the final day to bring them in). Any that arrive after the end of school on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> will have to go home again. But don't worry, the staff will be reminding the children throughout the week.
- $\Rightarrow$  Children will post their cards into boxes in each classroom.
- ⇒ No Christmas cards must be sealed by licking the envelope as this would be a significant transmission risk. Please only fold in the envelope top.
- ⇒ Please ensure the envelopes have the full name of the child they are written for, and include the class number:

- ♦ Class 3 Mr Worpole and Mrs Standish Y4/Y5/Y6
- $\Rightarrow$  All the cards will then be quarantined for 72 hours and then over the weekend.
- ⇒ Staff will sort the cards for the children.
- ⇒ Cards will then be quarantined again for 72 hours.
- ⇒ Staff will give the cards out for children to take home and open.
- ⇒ This process has been checked with Telford & Wrekin Health & Safety team to ensure it is Covid secure.

Card giving and receiving is great fun but it is a choice. If you do not want to receive any cards into your household, please just let school know- email the office on <u>a3091@telford.gov.uk</u> and we will not send any cards home.

### **GETTING A COVID-19 TEST**

### You MUST get a test if:

You have at least one of the three main symptoms.



temperature



persistent



of taste or smell

ISOLATE as soon as symptoms show, while waiting for test results and if you test positive.

You **CAN** get a test for these precautionary symptoms:



**Headaches** 



**Aches and** 



**Feeling very** 



Sore throat





Sneezing



You DO NOT NEED TO ISOLATE if you have only one or more of these precautionary symptoms, or while waiting for test results for these precautionary symptoms.

You only need to isolate if you test positive or have at least one of the three main symptoms.

### Class One


This week in our maths lessons children have been working on comparing numbers and quantities and using the language of more or less. In Forest School, the children completed tree rubbing artwork collages.
