This week in Class 2 we have been working on subtraction in Maths. We have built up to exchanging confidently when needed and have used physical resources to help visualise the concept. We have continued our work on timelines in History and looked at the life of a fictional Argentinian character called Mafalda; in keeping with our Cultural Pathways work in school. On Thursday afternoon, we started the first of two sessions in Forest School where we built stick frames ready to use next week; we will use these with cameras to frame different views of school. The children did brilliantly learning to select appropriate sticks, plan frames and tie knots to hold their frames together.

CLASS 3

This week years 5/6 learnt about Artificial Intelligence. We discussed the advances in Robot technology and looked back at the famous Chess match between Gary Kasparov and Deep Blue.


We all took part in a Turing Test to see if we could identify a robot from the answers it gave to simple questions. We were unable to tell which people were human!


We also challenged a computer program to games of Noughts and Crosses. The computer won every time!
