

Remote Education Offer

Remote Education Provision: Spring 2021

St Lawrence CE Primary School

Where a class, group or a small number of pupils need to self-isolate, or local and national restrictions require pupils to remain at home, St Lawrence CE Primary School has developed the capacity to offer immediate remote education, as required by national government guidelines, within the resources and capability of the school and its staff.

St Lawrence CE Primary School will ensure remote education, where needed, is high-quality and aligns as closely as possible with in-school provision.

Here at St Lawrence CE Primary School, we have built on the high- quality online offer developed during the summer 2020 lockdown.

The basis for this is the online platform, SeeSaw, which enables pupils to share their work with teachers, modelled working and stories can be shared, teachers can respond to pupil work and parents have their own access to ask questions of teachers.

Feedback from parents and pupils during lockdown and the response of pupils to tasks (9000+ uploads of pupil work from 85 children during the first school closure) shows that this medium is highly effective in engaging and supporting pupils and their parents and carers to maintain good learning.

The school intends to further maintain links with the pupils through organised weekly 'Zoom' sessions where all pupils in the class can join in, and links with parents through planned telephone calls and updates. This weekly face to face catch up with pupils will be maintained through the remote education offer.

Remote Education Offer

Should there be a requirement for pupils to access remote education, as an individual, bubble or whole school, the offer will closely match the class-based



offer with selective use of resources such as Oak National Academy, White Rose Maths supplemented with teacher-based resources which mirrors the carefully planned and sequenced school curriculum.

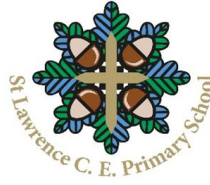
In their planning, staff will identify the remote learning offer and signpost parents to online videos and tutorials that will support the learning.

All parents and carers will receive an up to date weekly timetable which identifies the learning themes for each subject, including the foundation subjects, in order that they have an overview of the learning during the half term. This will be particularly useful for those parents and pupils who need to access the remote learning offer.

In order to ensure the remote offer is of similar quality to the face to face sessions, staff will on occasion, offer recorded sessions to demonstrate key points of learning such as mathematical calculation strategies and modelled reading. Staff will include clear explanations, scaffolded practice where needed, opportunities to apply and embed new knowledge or skills and provide feedback to pupils on their progress.

Pupils in the early stages of their formal education are likely to have needs which will require a more personalised programme of tasks and feedback. The focus here will be particularly on phonics and early reading where staff will provide a modelled approach to the phases in the Read Write Inc phonics learning approach, alongside information to offer guidance to supervising adults when practising phonic sounds or sharing books. Staff will record the reading and sharing of favourite and class stories for pupils to enjoy at any time.

Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities will require specific approaches tailored to their needs and circumstances in line with individual pupil plans. Those parents of SEND pupils, not accessing school will be offered weekly telephone calls from the class teacher to discuss learning approaches. Alongside this, St. Lawrence will offer a 'zoom' call from SEND Lead, Mr Al-Asmar and class teacher to further discuss targets on IPM.



Staff will maintain contact with parents of pupils with Education and Health Care Plans to ensure the most appropriate tasks and feedback is in place. Where appropriate, staff will offer remote 1:1 sessions for these pupils.

Staff will ensure regular phone calls to parents and carers of the most vulnerable pupils.

In all cases, teaching staff at St. Lawrence Primary know their pupils well and have engaged with parents and carers to discuss pupil needs. Staff and support staff will ensure the tasks reflect the needs of the pupils and are appropriately scaffolded where required, much as would happen in the classroom.

Tasks set, feedback and communication will be maintained through the SeeSaw platform, as it was during the summer lockdown and the school will continue to maintain an up to date list of online links to high quality resources on the school website.

Access to technology and connectivity

Pupils cannot attempt remote learning if they do not have access to a device and adequate connectivity. St Lawrence CE Primary School will check with parents that pupils do have the required technology and connectivity and will follow the national government guidelines to support those who do not.
