Our Values

Through 'The St Lawrence Way' we will explore our vision, intent and Christian values.

The words highlighted 'purple' are the words that we use with the children and they are displayed in every classroom and around school. The words are meaningful as they highlight to the children how we want them to behave and lead their lives.

School Attire

Could we please remind parents that children are representing St Lawrence throughout the school day and all pupils come into school looking neat and presentable. St Lawrence does not allow children wearing nail polish or large earrings. We do accept small ear studs but these need to be covered during a PE session with surgical tape or a plaster that has been brought in from home. We understand that school uniform is difficult to purchase currently, but we ask that wherever possible they do not wear logo sweatshirts.





Easter Celebrations in School

More details and sponsor forms will be sent out early next week.






British Summer Time 2021

Class 2


This week has been a jammed pack one! We have begun our work on Division in maths; the children have all done brilliantly with this tricky concept and we will continue this work either side of the Easter Break.

Division is sharing a number into equal groups. Sometimes there is some left over...a remainder.






Spring has Sprung For Years 5 & 6

The daffodils inspired us in our artwork this week. We hope you enjoy looking at our gallery of daffodil sketches.




"I thought it would make the picture better, if I sketched the daffodils from different angles."
