Dear Parents, 1st April 2021

We have really benefitted from the gorgeous Spring weather this week and children have enjoyed having the freedom of playing on the field at breaktimes and lunchtimes. The warm, sunny days have brightened the mood and supported some of the Easter celebrations we have held in school. We even managed a socially distanced whole school Easter bonnet parade and singing session which was just marvellous!

Thank you to all who took part or supported the Easter Bonnet Parade yesterday. The children's creations were amazing once again and it was nice to be able to do something that we would normally do. It is these events in school that make all the difference, as they reinforce a culture of community and tradition which we hold dear at St. Lawrence. Many thanks to the PTFA for organising prizes for this event.

The children have been learning about Easter in school in their Religious Education sessions and through worship time. Although they haven't been able to go to church, they understand why Christians celebrate Easter and that Jesus died so that mankind could be forgiven. It was lovely to see so many of you in attendance (albeit in a virtual capacity), at today's Easter Worship and we truly apologise for the technical difficulties that it made it very difficult. Hopefully you will have seen the wonderful work on display that demonstrates children's understanding in your class zoom sessions.



When we return after the Easter holiday we will be focusing on our guiding principle of 'Respecting and Caring' which fits in with the Christian values of Respect and Justice in our Worship sessions. The return of all our pupils has been on the whole extremely positive, with the recovery curriculum supporting children's ability to talk and express their feelings. We now need to shift the focus during the summer term and work on building children's awareness and understanding of diversity. As we have all become more insular due to the pandemic, we now need to support the children to be more open

minded, accepting one another whatever their differences, and to teach them to always be respectful.



Mrs Barker will return to school following her maternity leave on Monday 19th April and we look forward to welcoming her back to the St. Lawrence community. We bid farewell to Mr Worpole and thank him for all his hard work and commitment, during what has been, an extremely difficult year in teaching. We wish him the very best of luck in his new post. We will be altering the structure of Class 3 slightly for the duration of the Summer term, as Mrs Standish will teach pupils in Year 4 and 5 whilst Mrs Barker will teach our Year 6 pupils, supporting their transition to secondary school.

The internet provides opportunities for young people to explore the world, make friends and to develop their potential – they have grown up not knowing life before the internet. Young people have two lives – 'online' and 'the real world' and there can be much overlap. Sadly, there can also be a high level of risk inherent online, especially for young
