Dear Parents, 30th April 2021

We have had a lovely week in school and all the children have settled back in to school life very well after the Easter break. Our Class 3 children have had a different arrangement on their return, with Year 6 being taught as a single year group with Mrs Barker as their class teacher, and Y4/Y5 being taught as a mixed age class with Mrs Standish. We have been really pleased with how well the children have adapted to the changes we have made. It has been lovely to welcome Mrs Barker back in to school after her maternity leave and I know the children have been really pleased to see her.



We will continue to use SeeSaw as an online platform for communicating our weekly homework. We found SeeSaw was most effective during the period of school closure so we are keen to keep this as a communication tool from school to home. Homework will be uploaded on a Friday with an expectation that it will be completed and

uploaded by Wednesday of the following week, this allows our teaching staff marking and feedback time before setting new tasks. If you should experience difficulties with your child's login details, please do get in touch with school and we will try to resolve this.

This week we welcomed Reverend Helen in to school to deliver our whole school weekly Worship. This was done in a virtual capacity from the Head Teacher's office but it was a step closer to normality and wonderful to have a 'live' assembly delivered by her. We thank Rev. Helen for taking the time to lead this as we know she is extremely busy. Our whole school theme this term is our school value of 'Respecting and Caring' which is one of



our guiding principles of the 'St. Lawrence Way' this relates to the Christian value of Respect and Justice.

As you may be aware our annual statutory SATS and Phonics Screen assessments for pupils in Year 1, Year 2 and Year 6 have been scrapped by the government for this academic year as a result of the pandemic. Please be assured that we continue to work towards children achieving similar standards and we will keep you well informed of your child's progress against these standards.



We have had notification of the places allocated to our Reception September 2021 intake and it has been lovely to see that some younger siblings will be joining us from September. We will be sending out further information shortly to parents concerning transition.

Next week will be shorter than usual with Bank Holiday Monday and the Polling Day on Thursday 6th May. We do apologise for any inconvenience with the Polling Day, unfortunately this is completely out of our hands. We will be sending work via SeeSaw for the day for those children not in school. By instruction from the DfE will remain open for the children of our critical workers. Should your child require a place please contact the school office by Tuesday at 12 noon so we can make the necessary arrangements. Children in school on that day will need to bring a packed lunch as the kitchen will be closed.

Finally, I would like to say a huge thank you to the PTFA for all their hard work and enthusiasm, during what has been an extremely difficult year for fundraising. I know they met with Mrs Nash earlier in the week to discuss events for the Summer and beyond and are always seeking out innovative ways to raise money for the benefit of all the children here at St. Lawrence. This week we had 13 brand new iPads delivered to school for use in classes and this new technology has funded by our PTFA. We are keen to sustain this group who work so hard to plan events so that we have money to fund the additional extras that make the difference. 

"I didn't put too much paint on my cotton bud so you can see the colourful blossom."







This week, following on from last week's Religious Education focus, we looked at and discussed the Ten Commandments and Moses as we continue our study on Judaism.
















Class 3 This Week


