

Maths

During the Summer Term, we will start by working on Fractions before moving onto Division. Alongside these blocks, we will learn about concepts within Geometry and Time.

We will be using a concrete, pictorial, abstract approach to our Maths; seeing concepts physically and visually before applying them.

Art/DT

Our learning in Art will focus on the life and work of famous artists. During the second half term, we will complete a DT project linked to our learning in Art lessons.

Computing

In Computing, we will work on our coding skills using Scratch to tell stories and create themes.

Geography

In Geography, we will name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capitals cities of the United Kingdom. We will also look at surrounding seas.

English

Our work in English will be fuelled by our texts and stories based on The British Isles & Values. We will develop our skills for writing genres that include: traditional stories, poetry, shape and concrete poems and fables.

In Guided Reading lessons, we will continue to use the Book Talk model to help the children develop comprehension and inferencing skills. Standalone SPaG sessions will also continue to be taught throughout the term.

Music

This term, the focus will be on music from within the British Isles. We will develop our understanding of rhythm, beat and tone.

Religious Education

During the Summer Term, we will be exploring Judaism in the first half term and 'When Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?' in the second half term. Class and school worships will continue.

Science

This term in Science, we will focus on plants. We will investigate the parts, types of and characteristics of plants. The vocabulary needed when studying plants will also be worked on.

In Class Assemblies and throughout school we will be looking at our school values and Healthy Eating and Lifestyles.

Languages

This term the children will be looking at countries that speak Spanish as well as learning the language.
