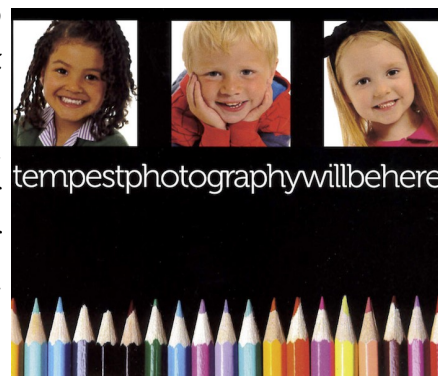
Dear Parents,

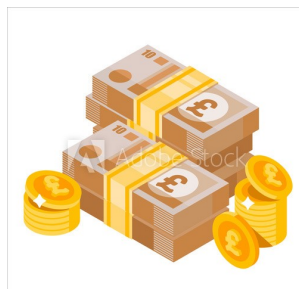

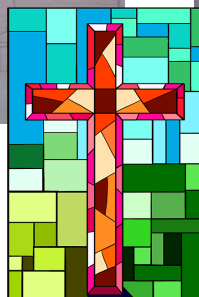


People go to church to speak to God and the sun always shines bright with Jesus. People also go to church to learn how to be peaceful.

Our continued work on Paul Klee in Art this week has taken the form of recreating our designed artwork in his style using physical printing and paint. Here are some examples.



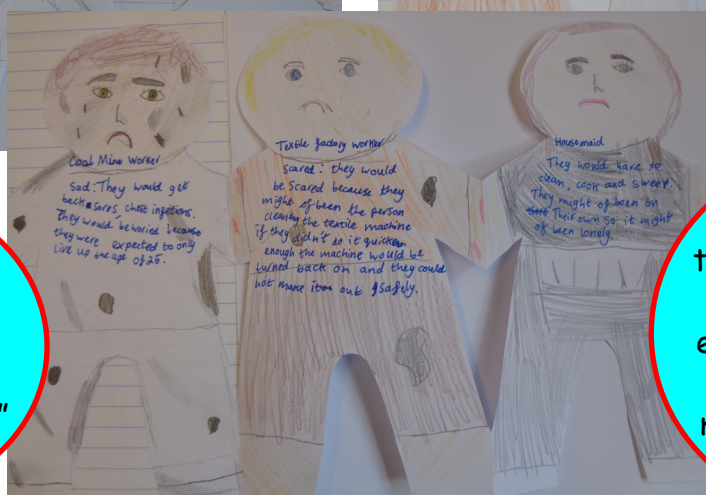
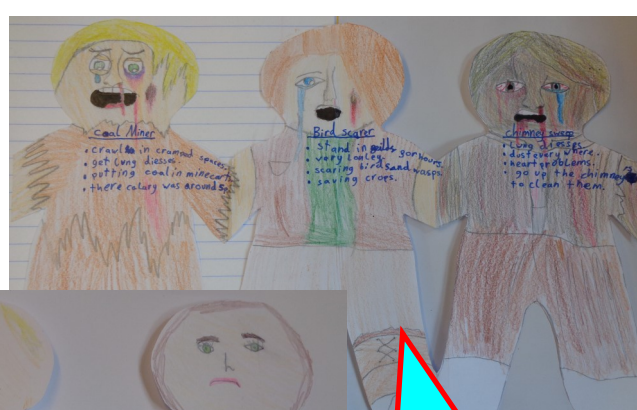
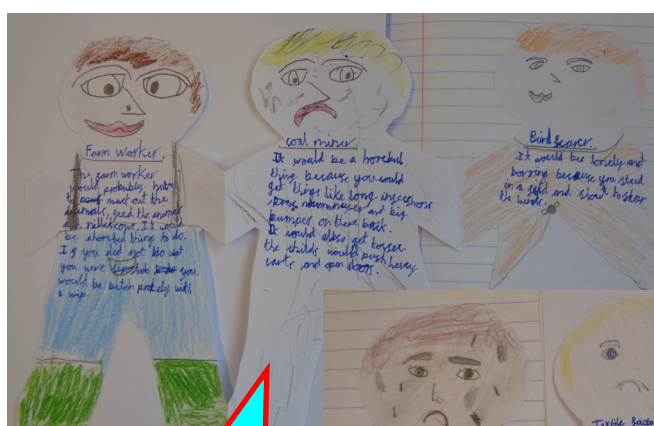
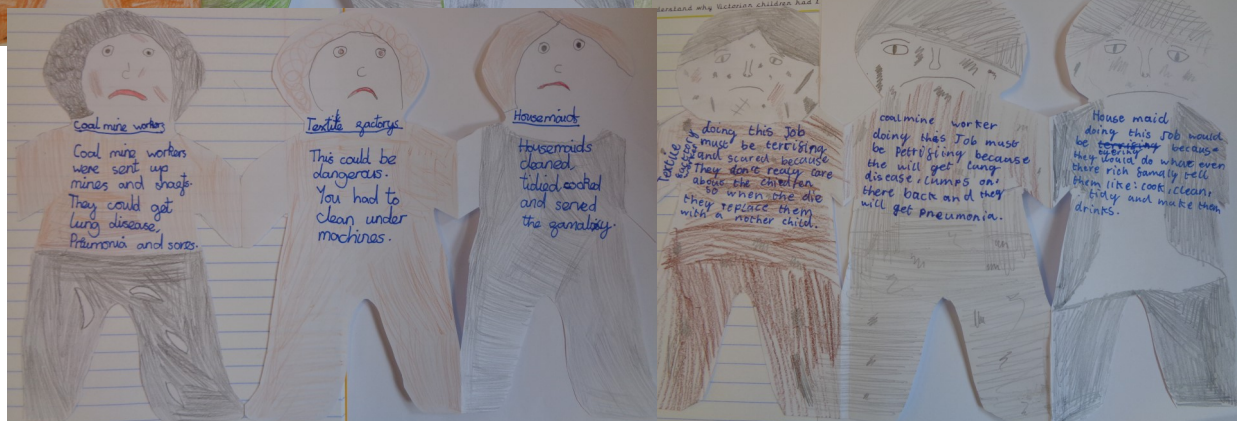
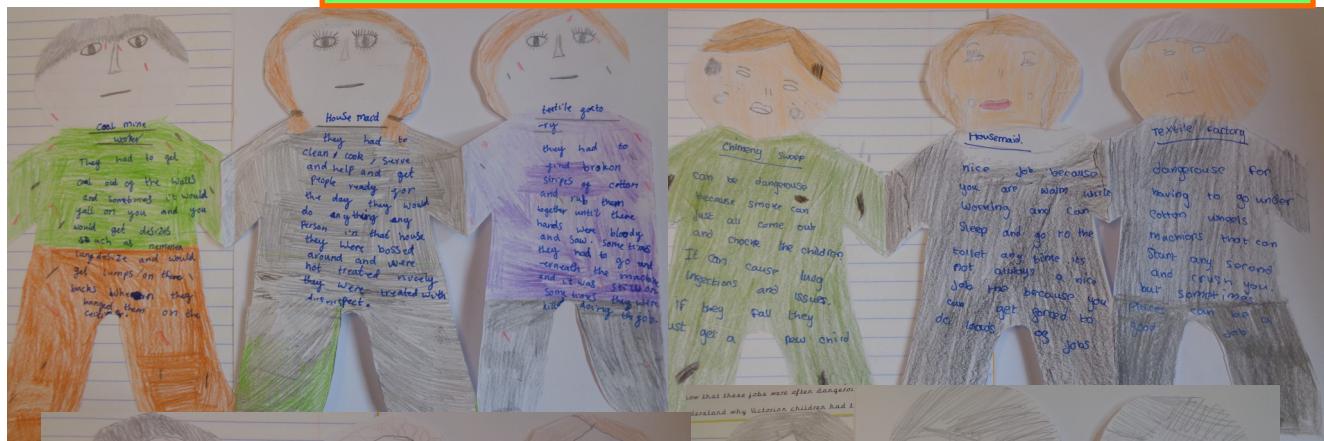


Class 3 News

Year 6, have been continuing on their Andy Warhol style, art journey. This week they have enjoyed sketching an object before transforming it with colour.



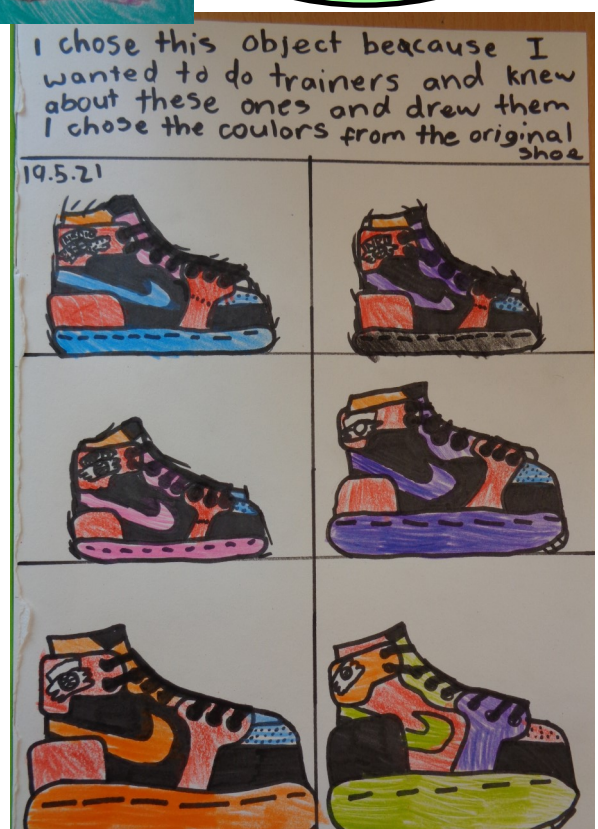
"I chose the penguin because it is my favourite show. I love the different colours."
