





As we come to the end of the first week of May, the science experiment seedlings have begun to shoot and demonstrate to us that with the right growing conditions, plants can grow in any space!

The knot is really strong for making shelters.





"We could try the meal worms and crickets. I ate five mealworms and one cricket!"










