SPORTS DAY





<u>Our Artist In Residence</u>



Art has been one of our focused subjects this term and we have been enhancing the profile of this subject in all classes and year groups. Last half term the focus was on Printing and teachers looked carefully at the progression document to map our skills required across the year groups. This half term (summer term), our focused skill is sketching/drawing and children will be focusing on self-portraits. Henry our Artist in residence, has been supporting the children to develop their pencil skills in order to organise line, tone, shape and colour. This is a piece of art work that Henry has created to show the children.

Staggered Start and Finish Times

From September we will continue with the staggered start and finish times until further notice. Parents and residents of Preston have commented on how much better it has been alleviating some of the congestion round the village and we feel it will benefit our new starters in the first few weeks of term.

As we have done previously, you may drop siblings at the earliest time and collect at the later time.



Class 1 had a brilliant time in the quiet garden. We needed to transplant the pumpkins and runner beans which had got too big for their small pots in the poly tunnel. The children used trowels, forks and spades to dig over the soil in one of the raised beds and then helped to construct a frame from garden canes for the runner beans to grow up. Then they planted the pumpkins and gave everything a very good water so we are really hoping for a bumper crop.

This week, Class 2 have been incredibly lucky to have been working with our resident artist Henry. We worked on our sketching skills, creating self-portraits. The skills taught to us by Henry helped us to be wonderful artists; using sketching techniques to create amazing self-portraits.















This week, everyone in Class 3, had a natural art session in our Forest School. After sketching the only 'paint' they could use had to come from flower petals, wheat leaves or ochre. Ochre is a natural clay earth pigment, which you may have seen used in cave paintings. Both the ochre and the plants were sourced very locally on Mrs Sankey's farm. We think the results look beautiful.

We were so impressed when we read the children's work and they should be very proud of themselves!


We then used blindfolds to make it more challenging as well as having certain group members 'stranded' so that we had to rescue them. We all worked well as a team and made it back to dry land!

Wild World Heroes Summer Reading Challenge 2021

Wild World Heroes Summer Reading Challenge 2021 is a nature theme challenge where children can join the Wild World Heroes and discover how they can make a difference to the environment.

The Challenge starts on Saturday 10th July and ends on Saturday 11th September 2021.



Children aged 4 – 11 years can help the Wild World Heroes on a new adventure by reading 6 books over the summer holidays. When they join they will receive a collector's pack and their first set of stickers. When they have read their 6 books they will receive two more sets of stickers, certificate and medal.

Children can read any books in any format, fiction, non-fiction, picture books, audio books, eBooks and eAudio books via our Libby App.

How do schools benefit?

- The Summer Reading Challenge is intrinsically **inclusive** and can contribute to the achievement of **all** pupils, including pupils with special educational needs, disadvantaged pupils and the most able
- It enhances and supports your school's reading policy and your mission for all children to **read widely and often**
- It prevents the tendency for children's reading to **dip over the holidays** The Challenge helps to support the **social** and **cultural** development of pupils in a fun, creative and child-directed way
- It encourages comprehension skills such as using imagination and empathy to explore a text beyond the page
- It develops a growth mind-set for children who take part
- The Challenge allows children to become more **independent** in their reading when choosing books
- It allows children to **master** aspects of reading through using pertinent and specific vocabulary when talking about books
- It takes place at **your local library** and is a brilliant opportunity for **extracurricular activity** within your local community, to foster **family literacy** and home-school links
- The Challenge supports the successful transition between year groups and stages
