We have had another very positive week in school and the children have been enjoying the glorious sunshine at breaktimes and lunchtimes. It has been lovely to see the older children in school looking after our youngest pupils, helping and supporting them to engage in play activities. Staff have been sharing wonderful anecdotes of what they have been observing and how our key values taught through the 'St. Lawrence Way' are embedded through the relationships children have with one another.



We are quickly establishing our new routines and ways of working so there is consistency across the classes and key stages. Children have now voted for our School Council and we have representatives from Year 1 to 6 who will be meeting weekly to represent the pupil voice across school. This group of children will seek the views of their peers so that the pupil voice is heard and at the forefront when we are making decisions. We will look forward to hearing more from this group of children in the coming weeks.

<u>House Captains</u>

As you will be aware, children in school belong to a 'House' and our houses are named after the Patron Saints; St. George, St David, St. Patrick and St. Andrew. To represent our houses we have House Captains who are elected from Year 6 and we operate a house point system within school for rewards. Children are awarded house points during the week if we feel they are modelling our key values consistently well and embracing the St. Lawrence Way and showing us they can 'be the best they can be with God'.

<u>Covid</u>

As a school we are acutely aware of the rise in cases within the borough of Telford and Wrekin and we are following up to date guidance given to us by the Telford Protection Health Hub. A positive case in school means that we follow all the guidelines set out by the Health Hub and we have a risk assessment and checklist in place to ensure we minimise risk to all in the school community. If you do receive a letter about your child being in contact with a person who has tested positive on a PCR test we ask you to follow the guidelines diligently. There is no longer a need to close a bubble where a contact has been but we politely ask that you remain vigilant for symptoms. Please inform us of any positive tests within the household as this will support our reporting system. We have a Coronavirus Outbreak Management Plan to help manage increased transmission of COVID-19 within the school when the following thresholds are reached:

• 5 children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period;

or • 10% of children, pupils, students or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period

If we meet the thresholds we will revert back to the bubble way of working and staggered arrangements to reduce transmission.

We are finding the morning staggered 'drop off' extremely successful not only has it eliminated traffic and congestion issues but it has enabled staff to establish effective morning routines including hand washing. Our Class 1 and 2 pupils can arrive from 8.45am and Class 3 and 4 pupils between 8.55 and 9.00am. Moving forward, if you are experiencing the later drop off time inconvenient with work commitments, we are

suggesting that you can drop off from Monday at the earlier time of 8.45am. We hope this flexibility supports those of you who have made enquiries.

Once again we are collecting produce for Telford Crisis Support who are really busy supporting people and families across the borough with the foodbank and breakfast parcels.
