We are supported by Public Health and act on advice whenever we have a positive case within our school community. We will inform classes where there is a positive case so that parents of children in that class can remain vigilant. There is no need for bubble

closures at this time, but should symptoms develop, get your child a PCR test immediately. We ask that you remain in communication with school and confirm immediately if your child has a positive PCR test. We thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Where classes have been affected by teacher absence we will use our HLTA Carmen Leon, for short term cover. For longer absences we will use supply teachers in order to offer stability and continuity, with class teachers providing the work to ensure curriculum coverage.
