# <u>Author Visit</u>

On Monday, we welcomed local author Sarah Griffiths to St. Lawrence to lead KS1 and KS2 workshops. She read her books 'Finding Stones for Grandma' and 'When the Fireflies Came'. Sarah explained about her life as an author and later answered children's questions. She told us that her first book took five years to publish and her favourite book that she has written is 'Sophie's Spectacles' because this is about building self esteem. After reading 'When the Fireflies Came' she explained how the book came about and the fact that her inspiration came from enjoying walks in nearby Apley Woods, as there is an enchanted tunnel of trees that she loves there and she wondered what it would be like to meet mother nature there. She explained that Alex was a boy that she knew and this was the basis of her story. The children were excited to hear about where she gets her book ideas from and how, when drafting, she plans a few different endings. They were surprised to hear that the book drafts may only take 2-3 hours to write, however the editing and illustrating process sometimes takes a whole year. Sarah explained that she hasn't written a long chapter book yet but may well do in the future because at the moment she enjoys writing short rhyming story books. She gave the children 3 tips to become an author which were

- 1. Read something that you enjoy every day
- 2. Write something every day even if its just notes in a diary
- 3. Use your imagination to go anywhere, be anyone or do anything
