Dear Parents,

This week we have seen that Covid remains an ever present challenge in school and many of you will be aware that a high proportion of Class 4 pupils have been affected. May I extend my thanks to all parents for their vigilance and support this week. We have pockets of cases in all classes but we are working closely with the Health Protection Hub, following their up-to-date advice, to minimise spread. I send my very best wishes to you all and hope that nobody is too unwell with the new variant.

It is reported that it poses less risk to our health but the new variant is more easily spread and whilst isolation rules remain this does impact on staff and pupil attendance. We are hopeful and committed, as far as possible, to all year groups remaining in school. If your child comes home and reports they haven't been taught by their usual teacher for a few days, please note that this will have been unavoidable. I will continue to keep parents informed of any significant changes next week and send out any further guidance from the Health Hub, where necessary.

£12,000 prize pot breakdown

The best bit is that every school has an equal chance of winning. The prizes will be awarded based on the schools that have collected the most tokens per pupil from Reception to Year 6 – so smaller schools have the same chance as larger ones.
