Dear Parents,

It has been lovely to see so many of the children back in school this week after their period of self-isolation. We have small pockets of cases in classes 2 and 3 this week but things are considerably improved. Thank you to parents for their vigilance and notifying us as soon as possible so that we can put contingency plans in to operation. Currently, we are operating in two bubbles (KS1 and KS2) at playtimes and lunchtimes and avoiding any whole school shared worship. This contingency is helpful in identifying possible linked cases and reducing the transmission across school. We are hopeful that as cases decrease we can revert to our usual way of working.

I must place on record my thanks to teaching staff who have been providing home learning via SeeSaw for those pupils not in school alongside their teaching commitments. I have heard there has been a positive engagement from pupils working from home so this is wonderful to hear that the work set is being completed.

Earlier in the week I met with Rev. Helen Morby and Vickie Longson (Lead Christian Distinctiveness Advisor), to share the responses that I have had from parents, staff and pupils about the core values that epitomise the 'St. Lawrence Way'. I have to say, they were so impressed with the involvement from parents and some of the wonderful ideas generated. These collective ideas will be presented to governors at our termly meeting on 8th February and then we will be able to share the outcomes with you. We have also devised a new RE Long Term Plan which reflects our new class structure and meets the statutory requirements for the teaching of Religious Education. I have included a copy of this on the next page and you will also be able to view this on our school website. As you will see from the plan we teach Christianity and one other religion at Key Stage One and Christianity plus two other religions at Key Stage Two.

I am always extremely impressed with the children's mature responses to aspects of Religious Education and how they embrace learning about new religions with such awe and wonder.

This year, we are keen to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and do something extra special with the children to mark the Queen's 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth. 






Holocaust Memorial Day
