


'Being the best we can be, because with God all things are possible'

All parents, children and teachers have to do is collect as many tokens as possible that will appear every day in the Shropshire Star from **Thursday**, **March 3, 2022 to Saturday, April 2, 2022.** 

# £12,000 prize pot breakdown

The best bit is that every school has an equal chance of winning. The prizes will be awarded based on the schools that have collected the most tokens per pupil from Reception to Year 6 – so smaller schools have the same chance as larger ones.

For example, a small school with 50 pupils that collects 400 tokens would win when compared to a bigger school with 400 pupils that collects 800 tokens.

Five schools with the most tokens collected per pupil will have the chance to walk away with a cash prize and win a share of the £12,000 prize pot.

The first placed school with the most tokens collected per pupil will scoop a whooping **£5,000**, followed by **£3,000** for second, **£2,000** for third and then two **£1,000** awards, which will be presented to the fourth and fifth place schools

# <u>Plant a tree for the jubilee</u>

Shropshire's Queen's Green Canopy campaign has been given a huge boost thanks to a generous legacy from the late Richard Mayall and his wife Anne who lived near Harmer Hill

As from January 2022 anyone in the county wishing to plant a tree at home as part of the Queen's Green Canopy can collect a tree for free, together with a stake and tie from Shrewsbury Town Council's Weeping Cross Nursery, SY5 6HT or Prees Heath Nursery, Whitchurch, SY13 2HR. Please reserve your free tree, while stocks last, by filling in the simple form on <u>Shrewsbury Town Council website</u>.

The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a National project that the Shropshire Lieutenancy together with Shropshire County Council and Telford and Wrekin Council are supporting locally. It has been rolled out across Shropshire and the rest of the UK during the planting season from October 2021 to December 2022. This will be a long-lasting and valuable way to mark The Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. The Lieutenancy and the Councils are keen to help ensure that as many trees as possible are planted for the Canopy in Shropshire.

This initiative will promote the importance of trees for the environment in a sustainable and relevant way and, it is hoped, thousands of trees will be planted across the county as a lasting legacy. Each planting can be commemorated by marking it on the map on the <u>Queen's Green Canopy website</u>

Richard Mayall's daughter Ginny said "This is open to anyone and everyone who has space or can find space to plant an appropriate tree. Our mission is to get Shropshire firmly onto the QGC map. My parents loved and valued the natural world and were deeply concerned about the loss of biodiversity in the UK. They would have been delighted to see native trees being planted all over Shropshire. We welcome everyone to get involved."

# Eat Smart Dine with Let's Dine

## A MESSAGE FROM TELFORD AND WREKIN.....

Telford and Wrekin are inviting St Lawrence to take part in our January incentive scheme "Eat Smart" to encourage more pupils to have a hot meal as part of their school day that will be running at school from 24 January – 18 February 2022.

As you know Let's Dine Catering provided by Telford & Wrekin Council works in partnership with you and your school to provide healthy and nutritionally balanced meals in an enjoyable lunchtime experience that is open to all. Our January incentive scheme has been put together to encourage more pupils from all year groups to have a hot meal as part of their day.

By having a hot meal at school, it has long been recognised that nutrients from food fuel the brain as well as the body and children are more likely to remain focused during class and get the very best out of their learning. Research by the Children's Food Trust concluded that school meals are now consistently more nutritious than packed lunches from home and provide a better foundation for good health.

The meals provided by Let's Dine Catering and Telford & Wrekin Council use ingredients sourced and purchased from specially selected suppliers who are geographically as local to Telford as possible, using food products that are school compliant and have recognised certifications i.e. Red Tractor etc

As already mentioned "Eat Smart" will be running 24 January – 18 February. Between these dates pupils will need to have 15 hot meals to be entered into a prize draw to win an individual prize but also prizes for the school. Please see the attached poster for more information.
