Update from the School Safety Squad.⁷

Last week in school it was Safer Internet Day and all the children learnt about how to stay safe online. Following this the School Safety Squad have created some quizzes to find out how much the children have remembered about this very important topic. The class teacher will do the quiz with their class and the quizzes are different for each class depending the children's age, for example the quiz for class 1 and 2 is based on a story called 'Buddy the Dog', class 3's focuses on internet safety and class 4's covers both internet and phone safety. The School Safety Squad will then look at the answers from each class and take that information onboard to fill any gaps in their knowledge by delivering additional internet safety sessions. Thousands of pounds up for grabs in our Cash for Schools competition.

All schools who enter will be showcased in a special Cash for Schools supplement that will appear in the **Shropshire Star on Thursday, March 3, 2022,** which will signal the start of the token collect campaign.

All parents, children and teachers have to do is collect as many tokens as possible that will appear every day in the Shropshire Star from **Thursday**, **March 3, 2022 to Saturday, April 2, 2022.**

£12,000 prize pot breakdown

The best bit is that every school has an equal chance of winning. The prizes will be awarded based on the schools that have collected the most tokens per pupil from Reception to Year 6 – so smaller schools have the same chance as larger ones.

For example, a small school with 50 pupils that collects 400 tokens would win when compared to a bigger school with 400 pupils that collects 800 tokens.

Five schools with the most tokens collected per pupil will have the chance to walk away with a cash prize and win a share of the £12,000 prize pot.

The first placed school with the most tokens collected per pupil will scoop a whooping **£5,000**, followed by **£3,000** for second, **£2,000** for third and then two **£1,000** awards, which will be presented to the fourth and fifth place schools
