Dear Parents,

This week in classes children have been focusing on our six new core Christian Values and reading stories from the bible that teach them more about what that value means. Children have been creating large pieces of art, either individually or collaboratively, that will be displayed around school to embed the values of respect, courage, compassion, honesty, forgiveness and thankfulness. I have been so impressed with the standard of art work that has been produced and the children's understanding of the message depicted in the stories

from the bible.













Last week I received a letter from the 'The Thank a Teacher Campaign' run by the Teaching Awards Trust, established in 1998 by Lord David Puttnam CBE, to celebrate and recognise excellence in education to say that someone at St. Lawrence had been nominated by a colleague, parent or pupil. After a few failed attempts to login Mr Al-Asmar persevered and managed to retrieve the special mention. Please read below the message that was sent in recognition.

'St. Lawrence is a small school but what it lacks in numbers it makes up for in heart and community and that is driven by every single member, be teachers, support staff, catering or cleaning. The school embodies community spirit and covid has just further shown what a power house this school is when looking after its students welfare. My child currently has a key worker place, I think after every lockdown phase there has been a further development and improvement in the way the school delivers their learning, be it on site or via remote learning. It has been lovely to see the zoom sessions that have taken place allowing those at home and those at school to interact with each other. I know my child has found that particularly helpful as a lot of her close friends are at home at the moment. I feel that they have communicated with children and parents in a timely and appropriate manner, there has still felt very much an element of fun within the lessons and extra elements such as World Mental Health Day and World Book Day which is soon to be upon us, all being discussed and the children encouraged to participate wherever they are based. Its hard to put into words but I think at a time when everyone is concerned and our children have so many uncertainties about what might be happening next, St Lawrence has provided a great source of stability, not only focusing on education but wellbeing too. As a parent, whilst the pandemic has led to many concerns, at no point have I been concerned regarding my child's welfare and development at St. Lawrence. They've done a great job! 'Anonymous

As you can imagine, this message has truly meant the world to all the staff who work incredibly hard on a daily basis. The message is anonymous so we are unable to identify the person or persons who took the time to write this but we want to say a huge thank you for this wonderful message. The last two years have probably been the hardest for us all but our primary goal has been, and always will be, to place the children at the heart of all we do. Thank you for your kind words, all the staff were completely overwhelmed and appreciative.





On Monday, we were visited by Great British Olympic Archer Patrick Huston. Patrick showed us the bow that he uses for International Competitions and passed around his Gold Medals for us to hold. After his assembly, in which he answered questions about his career and life lessons, older children in school were given archery coaching sessions by Patrick. He commented on how enthusiastic, polite and accurate the children were throughout the sessions. Patrick was asked during his assembly about not achieving goals or dreams and how he handles this adversity by some of our upper KS2 children. He explained that even if you don't achieve the goal or dream, you have achieved so much working towards it on the journey.

Patrick will be starting archery sessions with KS2 classes after half term and running an afterschool club for KS2 children – if your child is interested, please contact the school office.
