Dear Parents,

It has been lovely to welcome back the children to school this week and we have been most impressed with the way they have come in to school with such a positive and mature attitude.

May I welcome our new starters and their families in to the school community also. It has been lovely meeting our new Reception cohort of 14 children who are already settling in very well. We will be continuing with our SeeSaw as our online platform for communication between school and home so please bear with us as we set up new classes and add additional pupils. Once this is up and running effectively, we will send a Parentmail to alert you.

We will be carefully monitoring attendance and punctuality this year as many schools are reporting a decrease in school attendance in the post pandemic period. It is important that this returns to pre-pandemic levels to help narrow any gaps academically, socially and emotionally that the pandemic may have created for our pupils.

Please ensure that you contact school on the morning of the first absence either by telephone (you may a leave a message) or alternatively emailing the school office on a3091@taw.org,uk. so that your child's absence can be recorded appropriately on the attendance system. We appreciate the support we get from parents at St. Lawrence ensuring that children attendarce regularly and arrive at time.


CLASS 4 - Wednesday & Friday PE

Breaktime Snacks

The School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme (SFVS) provides a free piece of fruit or vegetable to every 4-6 year-old who attends a fully state-funded primary, infant or special school. This means that children in Reception, Year One and Year Two have a choice of fruit daily. This sadly doesn't extend to Key Stage 2 children so we do ask parents to provide a mid morning snack for their child.
