We had a visit from Erin who co ordinates the food parcels and she was absolutely delighted with the generosity of the parents and pupils here at St. Lawrence. Our school aspiration al target was to have 100 items but we exceeded the target and 106 items were donated, which was just marvellous!

Erin spoke to the children and explained that this year alone Telford Crisis Support have provided 140,000 meals and they provided 90,000 during the first lockdown. The children were fascinated and asked some insightful questions. It was lovely to see our school half term value of *Compassion* being used.



Erin was most impressed with the questions and explained that the food donated gets sent to a unit in Halesfield where it is sorted and organised. The parcels are tailored for the family needs for example, if they need baby food, nappies or pet food.
