As we come to the end of our first half term we have so much to celebrate. All our classes have been out of school on an enrichment visit to support the learning taking place, we have met with parents for consultations and yesterday the children performed so beautifully for our Harvest Celebration. We would like to thank you for joining us in church yesterday and for those of you who have taken the time to send in emails and messages of how much you enjoyed our Harvest Celebration.

A very well done to our new reception starters who have their first half term with us— what a long way they have come in such a short space of time. I am sure you will all agree that their song in church was most endearing.

As I mentioned in church yesterday, we were most grateful for all the Harvest donations that went to Telford Crisis support. We had a visit from Erin who coordinates the food parcels and she was absolutely delighted with the generosity of the parents and pupils here at St. Lawrence. Our school aspirational target was to have 100 items but we exceeded the target and 106 items were donated, which was just marvellous!

Erin spoke to the children and explained that this year alone Telford Crisis Support have provided 140,000 meals and they provided 90,000 during the first lockdown. The children were fascinated and asked some insightful questions. It was lovely to see our school half term value of *Compassion* being used.

KS1 Athletics Festival at Telford College

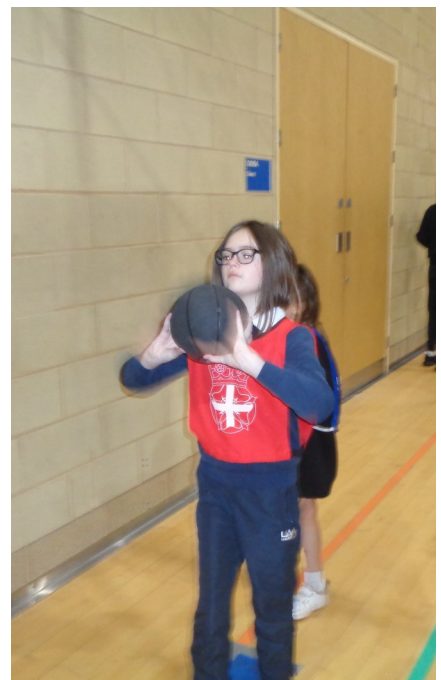


Children in Year 5/6 and KS1 were an asset to the school this week in their Athletic competitions.
