Dear Parents,

Another week has flown by with lots of learning taking place in school and out on educational visits. The purpose of visits is to extend and enrich learning opportunities linked to the themes that are being taught in class. I am sure that you will agree, that children really benefit from these experiences and they are a way of enhancing classroom learning by making real world connections. During the course of the year, children will have opportunities to go out on visits or we will bringing visitors in to school.

Class 2 Visit to Blue Planet Aquarium in Ellesmere Port

On Wednesday, Class 2 visited Blue Planet Aquarium to support their learning on their theme 'What is lurking in the depths of the sea?' linked to their Science and Geography curriculum. Children participated in a workshop and were very close to the sea creatures in the tanks and tunnel. We were most impressed with the questions that children asked in order to find out more and as usual, St. Lawrence pupils were commended on their behaviour, depth of understanding and enthusiasm.



<u>Class 4 Visit to Anglo Saxon Museum</u>

Yesterday, class 4 visited the Shrewsbury Museum for a fun filled Anglo Saxon workshop in the morning, with time to explore the gallery in the afternoon. The children had a fantastic time burying an Anglo Saxon skeleton, learning about Anglo Saxon letters, making runes out of clay and examining artefacts. Their knowledge and interest was noted so well done to the children on their fantastic questions and answers throughout the day!



We look forward to hearing about the forthcoming visits that have been planned this half term for Class 1 and Class 3. It is wonderful seeing learning brought to life and children showing their understanding and depth of knowledge. We would like to thank parents for supporting the educational visits organised and the positive feedback.

Read-to-Write Scheme

This year we have a purchased a new writing scheme called **Read-to-Write** which empowers teachers to provide high quality teaching of writing through high quality literature. The units of work centre on engaging, vocabulary rich texts which we call the 'Vehicle text'. Many of the carefully selected vehicle texts have strong thematic links to science, history and geography which are our curriculum drivers. They also enable us draw upon the wider curriculum, which helps us to build a rich, connected curriculum for our pupils. Our school philosophy is '*Reading and writing float on a sea of talk'* so talk is embedded in to the curriculum model. Our aim is to encourage children to use the author's choice of words in their own writing, using ambitious vocabulary and word choices to further improve their work.

Some examples of the impact of our new writing approach.

Class 2 have been learning the meaning of new words including **glimpse, translucent, mysterious and echoed.** During our visit to the Blue Planet Aquarium Esmae was heard saying *'I just caught a glimpse of that mysterious, translucent jellyfish looming behind a rock.'*



people are now being treated for mental health problems every month. That's more young people than ever before seeking support - and most aren't getting the help they need. This needs to change. With your support, it can.


