Here are some of the things that have been happening in school this week and the wonderful learning taking place.

Class 4 Visit to Millichope Estate

Yesterday, Class 4 visited the Millichope Estate in Craven Arms as part of our new geography topic based on Shackleton. The geography based Autumn 2 topic involves learning about grid references, reading maps and keys, and understanding compass directions and yesterday morning the children took part in a fabulous fieldwork activity where they had to collect tokens from key points around the estate by following instructions and reading complicated maps. Mrs Standish, Mrs Leon and Mr Matthews were very impressed with the children's resilience and geographical skills shown throughout the morning. During the afternoon, the children were able to explore the wonderful forest school activities on offer including roasting chestnuts on the fire, wading through a stream, and exploring the outside adventure area (where the children got suitably muddy!) 
Class 1 Oral Hygiene Workshop
