For those of you celebrating Mother's Day we hope you have a wonderful day being appreciated by those you love. For those without mothers our thoughts are with you.






#### Red Nose Day



#### **SCHOOL DINNERS**






Could we ask that all outstanding dinner money please be paid by Wednesday 29th March. This will ensure that there will be no outstanding debt towards the school for the new financial vear.
