Community Concern:

We have received information that a group of teenagers have been arranging fights in Newport and that these fights are being streamed online at a cost of £5 with the winner of the fight being awarded a cash prize.

Whilst it should be said that unlicensed boxing is not illegal per se, all boxing (including unlicensed 'white collar' boxing) is risk assessed with the appropriate equipment, safeguards and medical support being provided.

Fighting in the street or other public place would be considered a criminal offence, not least an affray, an offence which could bring a custodial sentence if convicted.

The other concern this raises is around the likely harm that can be caused during fights. What may start off as a 'boxing bout' may quickly turn into a 'street brawl'. Our team have been busy visiting those that we suspect of being involved and educating them on both the risk to their health, but also the likely consequence should the Police receive any reports of them fighting in public. If we receive any reports of individuals fighting then they should expect that this will be dealt with robustly.

If you have teenage children, we would appeal that you speak to them about this so they understand the consequences should they decide to join this trend.

Rural Crime update: The Telford 'Rural and Business Crime' team are investigating a series of offences relating to property that has been stolen from farms and building sites between October 2022 and March 2023.

Assisted by the Newport SNT, two search warrants were executed at addresses in Donnington on the morning of the 3rd April 2023 whereby two men were arrested on suspicion of conspiracy to steal. Property has been recovered from those addresses.

The men have been released from custody on conditional bail until the end of June 2023.
