


CLASS 2

Ready, Set, Read! Summer Reading Challenge 2023 is a sports and games themed challenge.

The Challenge starts on Saturday 15 July and ends on Saturday 16 September 2023.

It takes place at **your local library** and is a brilliant opportunity for **extracurricular activity** within your local community,

Children aged 4 – 11 years can help the Wild World Heroes on a new adventure by reading 6 books over the summer holidays. When they join they will receive a collector's pack and their first set of stickers. When they have read their 6 books they will receive two more sets of stickers, certificate and medal.

Children can read any books in any format, fiction, non-fiction, picture books, audio books, eBooks and eAudio books via our Libby App.

How do schools benefit?

- The Summer Reading Challenge is intrinsically **inclusive** and can contribute to the achievement of **all** your pupils, including pupils with special educational needs, disadvantaged pupils and the most able
- It enhances and supports your school's reading policy and your mission for all children to **read widely** and often
- The Challenge helps to support the **social** and **cultural** development of your pupils in a fun, creative and child-directed way
- It encourages comprehension skills such as using imagination and empathy to explore a text beyond the page
- It develops a growth mind-set for children who take part
- The Challenge allows children to become more independent in their reading when choosing books
- It allows children to **master** aspects of reading through using pertinent and specific vocabulary when talking about books
- The Challenge can help to close the gap for disadvantaged pupils
