CLASS 1



This week in Class one we have been exploring Guy Fawkes and Bonfire night. The children have been writing about the sounds fireworks make, they have used chalk and glitter to create their own firework pictures and created bonfires using natural materials in our Forest School session. We have also been learning about Circles, triangles and position in Maths and discussed the importance of poppies and Remembrance day.
