Dear Parents

We have a wonderfully busy week, with Advent beginning and worship in both schools marking this important time in the Christian calendar. The children are also enjoying counting down to Christmas on the advent calendars kindly provided by Magna foods and delivered to school by Mrs Dodwell-thank you very much on behalf of them all. Thank you to both schools' PTAs who have held film nights this week- much appreciated and lots of fun; thank you for supporting events such as these, they really help us to supplement trips, experiences and resources for the children. It was super to have St Lawrence parents in school for a craft event, and for Tibberton pupils to all enjoy a pantomime together, as well as their Christmas lunch in school. We have many more opportunities for parents to engage with school before the Christmas holidays, and we hope to see as many of you as possible at these events.

Our Christian Distinctiveness Advisor (CDA), Louisa, has arranged to meet with our new spiritual ambassadors in January so she can support them in developing this new, important role. These children are already off to a great start in their new roles, having already taken part in worship in school, and by planning how to broaden our courageous advocacy (the way in which we reach out and help others).

Could I ask you to please be mindful of our communications policy- we love sharing feedback with you about how your children are doing, and we welcome communication, however sometimes this can become stressful for staff when they are receiving numerous messages each day and on into the evening. During the day time, teachers are busy teaching so do not have time to reply to Seesaw messages. In the evening, teachers are assessing, planning and resourcing their lessons to enable your children to make progress and have exciting learning opportunities. They will reply to messages, but this may not be immediately, and I would ask you to consider whether a message needs to be sent, and the time you send it, or if a conversation in person would be better to be arranged.


Message from the ECO Team....
