The group of Class 4 children that did not attend Manor Adventure still had fun in class this week.








The children have been working on a project all week, linked to their book, Kensuke's Kingdom. The book is about a boy and his dog that become washed up on the shores of Kensuke's Island, whilst travelling around the world on his parents boat.

"We used newspaper to form the shape of our island. We then covered it in layers of Mod Rock, which dries really hard. It is the same material used to make plaster casts for broken bones."

Their project involved writing about an imaginary island of their own, naming it, drawing it, describing where in the world it was, it's climate, food sources, in fact creating a whole civilization with laws, flags and currency.

Alongside this, we also create a whole group 3D model of what we imagined Kensuke's Island may look like, using clues from the book. The result, I hope you will agree is amazing. Well done to everyone.


Well done to Tibberton Primary who also took part and came first.








due to it being used as a Polling Station by the local Council.





What to do if you think your child has measles and when to keep them off school - The Education Hub



Cases of measles are rising across England, including among children. It's an infection that spreads very easily and for some people can cause serious problems.

There's no specific medical treatment for measles, so it's important to get vaccinated as it's the best protection against becoming seriously unwell.

The measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine is one of the <u>routine childhood vaccinations</u>, so most children are already vaccinated against measles. If your child has received both doses of the vaccine, they are unlikely to have the virus.

What are the symptoms of measles?

Measles usually starts with cold-like symptoms, followed by a rash a few days later.

Some people may also get small spots in their mouth

What should you do if you think your child has measles?

You should ask for an urgent GP appointment or get help from NHS 111 if you think you or your child may have measles.

Don't go to the GP or any other healthcare setting without calling ahead first.

If your child has been diagnosed with measles by a doctor, they should stay off nursery or school for at least 4 days from when the rash first appears.

They should also avoid close contact with babies and anyone who is pregnant or has a weakened immune system.
