CLASS 1

This week in Class 1 we have continued exploring the story Handa's Surprise, we have thought and wrote about our own alternative ending. In Maths, we have been learning about simple maps and positional language, In our Afternoon sessions we have continued learning about the continent of Africa and the types of animals we would find in the Savannah.

CLASS 2



Class 2 visited the Botanical Gardens this week. We had a workshop with the lovely Lisa who was super impressed with our knowledge of plants and then we explored the glass houses and the

gardens. The children couldn't quite believe how hot it is in tropical countries and were amazed to find bananas hanging from trees! We even found the Kapok Tree from our previous story. They all represented St Lawrence beautifully and should be very proud of themselves.



CLASS 3

In Science we worked in groups to investigate how the volume of a sound differs when we move further away from the source of the sound. We used an ipad to play a

sound and measured out increments of 5 metres on the playground. We also used a decibel meter to record the volume of the sound. We found out that the volume decreases as the distance from the sound source increased. We have also been busy practising our class song for our Chance to Shine concert and making a few props to enhance our performance



CLASS 4

This week, year 6 have enjoyed taking part in Bikeability training and learning about how to ride safely on the road. We have written personal letters in role as a World War Two soldier and continued our work on lifecycles of mammals and plants.

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE IS CHANGING

FIRST OFFENCE



The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.



SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

The following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.



THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates; fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education'.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHOURISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthourised absence in a 10-week period.

The Health Protection Hub at Telford & Wrekin Council have asked us send out some information to you on summer water safety. With the current hot weather, children, particularly older children, may look to go swimming in open water to cool down and have fun. This comes with various risks – cold water shock, currents, hidden underwater dangers and diseases such as Weil's disease. 46% of drownings occur in the summer months and this rises to 75% amongst 13 – 17-year olds. Educating children on these dangers is important in preventing tragic incidents.
