
Class 2 have won this week's Attendance Trophy with an attendance figure of 100%






This week in school



CLASS 1



This week in class 1 we have continued exploring the story Funnybones with the children. The Year 1 children have been thinking about the features of a poster this week, whilst Reception has continued their Drawing Club journey. In Maths, the children have been learning to count back and on from a given number. In Geography this week the children have explored types of houses and human and physical features and in Computing we explored our laptops, we discussed its different parts and how to use the track pad accurately.



CLASS 2





Class 2 have been practicing their skills ready to plan and write a persuasive letter to the Wrekin Giant - I am excited to read this next week. We have also been making some beautiful pictures using various seeds during our outdoor learning and acting out the Creation Story in RE.

CLASS 3

This week in English class 3 have been working on planning their piece of independent writing to describe the Iron Man and analysing a WAGOLL (what a good one looks like). We have also had a go at some drama pretending to be the main character to help us think how this character moves and behaves. In Maths we have been learning how to flexibly partition numbers to 1,000 and 10,000. In outdoor learning we really enjoyed creating pictures from seeds following on from our learning last week about crops. Well done class 3!







CLASS 4



This week, class 4 have enjoyed making water filters to help out astronauts on the ISS. They used empty plastic bottles and a variety of filtering materials, then passed muddy water through their filters to see if they could obtain clear water. We have also created our own webpages to attract visitors to Glockenheim, the setting for our class book, Clockwork.

Because we stand brighter, together.








We will be holding a Book Fair from Friday 11th October to Wednesday 16th October in school.

Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) is national programme that aims to support the education and health needs of neurodiverse children in schools through a partnership approach working with local authorities and parent carer forums.

PINS will bring health and education specialists and expert parent carers into mainstream primary settings to:

- Help shape whole school SEND provision.
- Provide early interventions at a whole school level.
- Upskill school staff.
- Support strengthening of partnerships between schools and parent carers.
