Monday was an extra special day for St. Lawrence School, as we all came together to celebrate our Vision and Values relaunch.

Our day began with all of us gathering for Worship. We thought carefully about each of our values, Thankfulness, Respect, Honesty, Forgiveness, Compassion and Courage, what they meant to us and how we use them in our life, both in school and in our homes. Mrs Nash read in turn, a story from the Bible, that demonstrated these values in action and helped the children understand.

Following this in our classes we created some thoughtful artwork linked to our values.

Class 1 was Thankfulness and The Good Shepherd. Year 1 painted some wonderful pastural scenes with contented sheep grazing, whilst Reception created their own sheep on a plate.

Class 2 was Respect, linked to The Ten commandments. After creating handprints with paint, they wrote all of the Commandments along the digits. A brilliant way to remember God's message.



Class 3 had Honesty, linked to The story of Zacchaeus and

Forgiveness, linked to the story of The Prodigal Son. They enjoyed making their own puppet of Zacchaeus and retelling the story. To show Forgiveness the children created some beautifully coloured, scrunched tissue hearts.



Class 4 had Compassion, linked to the story of The Good Samaritan and Courage, linked to the story of Daniel in the Lion's Den. To show they understood compassion the Year 5's put together some care packages that others could access when feeling low and upset.

Year 6 drew and coloured some wonderful artwork based on when Daniel found himself thrown in with the lions.

In the afternoon we all went up to St. Lawrence Church for a special service to celebrate what we had all learnt about during the day and to share are artwork with everyone.
