Dear parents & carers,

Firstly, this week we would draw your attention to a letter from our Federation's Chair of Governors that outlines plans to consult parents on the proposal for both schools to join St Batholomew's CE Trust. We have previously corresponded with parents on the subject of joining a trust, but now governors wish to do so formally to gather your views. Recently, school leaders have had experience of working with colleagues from this Trust and our pupils have already benefitted from the continuous professional development offered to staff and advice on developing the curriculum. St Batholomew's is a local primary-only MAT that share complementary values to our own and their settings are very similar to Tibberton and St Lawrence. We hope to reap further benefits by joining a Trust in the way that being a Federation has helped with sharing staff, funding, expertise and knowledge as well as enabling our pupils to feel part of a wider community. In short, we wish to retain all the wonderful things about our two settings that we already cherish, but take advantage of being associated with a Trust that share our values and put children's learning and well-being at the very heart of everything they do.

At St Lawrence, the children have continued to work hard, and I have been so proud of their courage in sharing spoken outcomes for English units of work. As our Christian values remind us, having courage isn't always easy, but the children have really shown theirs recently. The children have also been good at remembering our school vision- being the best we can be- and thinking about how this means we are all different, with different talents, but that we can use our gifts to make a difference to others and the world.

Friends had their AGM recently and are looking to fund further improvements within Class One and also how we can construct a Sensory Den for the children.

I would also like to say a thank you to the St Lawrence Gardening Fairy who, with the support of Dobbies in Donnington, has visited to refresh the hanging baskets outside school. They are looking lovely- thank you for your support and hard work, Fairy!

This week in school



CLASS 1

This week we have been learning about a new story called Pumpkin Soup. Through this story we have been learning about the importance of friendship and why its important to listen to others. We have then been learning about how to interview the characters by asking questions, using question words and question marks. In Maths, we have been learning about fact families and representing numbers 4 and 5. In our Foundation subjects, we have been learning about holidays in the past, different lifecycles, the Nativity story and exploring types of sketching pencils in Art.





Class 2

This week in class 2 we have been doing lots of teamwork activities, we had to work together to act out a moving machine which was so much fun and then in forest we had to work together to create some big art using sticks and leaves. In English we have working on acrostic poems, which we will perform in class next week. In DT we have begun practicing our sewing skills ahead of our project too.

CLASS 3

This week in class 3, children have enjoyed learning more about the features of a non-chronological report and having a go at writing their own introductions about spiders. In maths, we have been learning written methods for subtracting with more than one exchange over across 10/100/1000.

In science, we have started our new topic classification of animals and learnt about vertebrates and invertebrates, grouping them by their similarities and differences.


