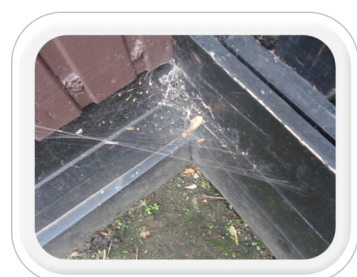
Class 2
