Dear parents & carers,

This week, we welcomed the "Make Sense of Pence" workshop to both schools as we sought to educate our pupils about financial literacy. As the world shifts towards a cashless society, it's crucial that we teach children the value of money, how to manage it, and how to make wise, financial choices. The pupils enjoyed the activities and challenges including debating the difference between needs and wants and whether a wristwatch really could be worth more than a mansion.

Parents at St Lawrence may have seen the inspection report from our Ofsted last month. We were very happy with its content and especially the fact that it recognised the work we have done around personal development and diversity since the last inspection. It is a testament to lots of hard work from staff and pupils and comments such as "pupils learn and well and flourish at St Lawrence" and "pupils say that the school is like a family" are very heartwarming. We have gone from having three improvements to make in our 2019 report to just a single one now and are reassured that our visitors found that "the school has improved since the last inspection".

At Tibberton, Mrs Woods has made an earlier start to teaching Class 3 than she had expected and we are grateful that she has filled the breach at short notice as Mrs Eden is off poorly. I'm sure the pupils have made Mrs Woods feel welcome and impressed her with their work and maturity. We do hope that Mrs Eden will be able to make it into school at some point next week to say her farewells.

There was an exchange of our resident guinea pigs for the day so that Class 1 at St Lawrence could learn about how to care for pets. Pupils judged the health of Lola, Priscella and Gloria by looking at their glossy coats, bright eyes and inquisitive nature. They had lots of attention from the children who demonstrated great patience and tolerance of God's creatures. Mrs Mountcastle was very proud of their behaviour.

This week saw a briefing for anyone interested in becoming the parent governor representing Tibberton and I hope that we can soon share with you some possible candidates and put the position out to ballot. A joint residential for Year 2 & 3 has now been booked for the middle of June following welcome feedback from parents and details of how to secure a place at Edgmond Hall will be available via Parentmail by the end of next week.

Just one week remains from a busy half-term before our week long holiday in February beckons. Telford & Wrekin are publicising their ever-popular Kids4£2, Urban Games and bike riding activities. There are also drop-in sessions at Southwater library where families can find a wealth of information and support.

## This week in school



#### CLASS 1

Class 1 have been working super hard!! This week we have been learning about non-fiction writing, we have explored the features of an information text and the importance of alphabetical order when reading non-fiction. In Maths, Year 1 have been learning about ordering, recognising and using numbers to 20. Reception have been learning about one more and less and odd and even pairs.

In our afternoons, we have been learning about human and physical features, how to look after pets and planning and creating our own backgrounds using scratch jnr. Well done Class 1.

# Today in maths we explored making pains explored making pains event and we all had such fun reading simon Sock and matching all the different kind of socks. We then showed what superstars — we were identifying odd and even numbers to 10!

#### CLASS 2



In Class 2 this week we have finished our Storm Whale text with a final independent write about the journey on the stormy sea. The children wrote some beautiful pieces including similes and some lovely emotive vocabulary. We have also participated in Children's Mental Health Week and spoke about what makes us proud, happy, sad, frustrated and how we can help ourselves as well as others to feel happier. We became super researchers in Science this week and explored the woodland habitat using websites to locate information about mammals and birds in the habitat.



#### CLASS 3

To enhance our topic about rocks and soil, Class 3 had a fantastic visit to the Ford Hall Farm. We crammed so much into a few hours! We looked at different types of soil and found out the importance of worms to soil structure and nutrition and how this in turn helps to sustain grassland to feed the animals. We fed pigs and cattle and went on an egg hunt. Much fun and fact learning was had by all! And the children behaved impeccably! Well done Class 3!



#### CLASS 4

As part of the NSPCC Numbers Day, Class 4 worked in groups to study a receipe for flapjacks. They went on to make the flapjacks before working out the costings to compare against the cost of shop bought flapjacks. They found out that a significant saving

could be made by making your own.

#### FRIDAY 14TH FEBRUARY

On Friday 14th February, we're asking children to wear red for a minimum donation of £1 and raise money for Midlands Air Ambulance Charity.

Midlands Air Ambulance Charity Midlands Air Ambulance Charity is responsible for funding and operating three air ambulance helicopters and a fleet of critical care cars serving the communities across the heart of England.

Each year it costs £16 million to maintain the three aircraft, critical care cars and the provision of a lifesaving service. Each air ambulance mission costs an average of £2,950. Each critical care car mission costs £288 on average. The charity does not receive funding from the Government for its daily missions so relies entirely on the support and generosity of local people and businesses.
